**Calvary Baptist International School:** The following is the Annual Report for the Academic Year 2005/2006. The school experienced the worst decline in the enrollment level due to the Ghana government's educational policy which made education free for the basic level. This action has almost collapsed most of the private schools in Ghana.



Brethren, because God has a purpose in His planting the school in Ghana, our school stood through this hard time. At the moment, the enrollment has began raising steadily. This is due to the unique nature of our school; we teach the children the way of salvation which is part of the school's curriculum.



The school has about four hundred students and a work force of twenty eight employees which includes teachers and other support staff.

**The School Infrastructure:** The school has three block buildings which together have nine classrooms and an office. We also have two classrooms in the middle of town which were given to us by the church. All these structures have been built through the help of brethren in the faith who are overseas.
