

PASTOR & MRS. JOSIAH ABEDU-KENNEDY - ACCRA



We praise the Lord for this opportunity to share with you what the Lord is doing in Crossroads Baptist Church, Accra. We have been serving Him in the ministry for ten years. Six of these years have been in Apam and four in Accra, the capital of Ghana.

Our young church has faced great challenges this year, but the Lord is faithful and continues to bless. In October of 2010, we lost our free place of worship; and after several months of searching, we finally found a temporary place of worship. However, in the next six months, we might have to relocate because the owner of the new location only gave us a six month agreement. We are now spending almost \$100 a month for rent, and this has been very difficult for our small church.

In the same month that the church relocated my family had to also relocate. Through these trials, the Lord is teaching us some lessons as a church and as a family. As a result, the church has intensified its soul-winning programs; and God is blessing! Many souls have been saved throughout the year, with some being obedient to baptism. A month ago, we had our annual Faith Promise

Missions Conference, with our other sister churches (New Life Baptist Church of Apam, Mumford and Kasoa); and the results were great. We are praying that our missions giving will improve so we can take on more missionaries this year.



Personal Prayer Requests:

1. Our support has drastically reduced so pray for an improvement in our monthly support.
2. Pray for us to raise about \$5000 to re-rent the house we are living in 2012.

Ministry Prayer Requests:

1. Pray for God's provision for a place of worship after our six months is up.
2. Pray for a piece of land. We have recently found a building lot for sale for \$30,000.
3. Pray for the New Life Baptist Church of Mumford for finances for a church building. The church purchased a piece of land four years ago. We are also praying for about \$25,000 to finish the Bible Institute in Apam.
4. Pray with us as we prayerfully plan to plant a new church in Swedru, a very busy commercial city in the Central Region.
